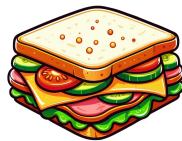

What have we been learning about this week!

Reception

Year 1

This week Year 1 have had another jam-packed week of fun learning. They have created innovative versions of a story in English lessons, used number lines and hundred squares to subtract amounts in Maths, as well as visiting our school woods to plant sunflower seeds, ready for our new Science topic all about Plants.

Year 2

Year 2 have had a wonderful week of learning too! They are budding authors! They have been basing their writing on 'The Snail and the Whale' by Julia Donaldson. They have been using such wonderful new words in their writing and they have planned their stories like true professionals. Well done Year 2

Year 3

Year Three have been busy writing our own stories based on the wordless book 'The Journey'. We have had some fantastic imaginative ideas!

We have also been busy making some props for our Egyptian day on Monday, which we are all looking forward to and will hopefully give the children an exciting day of practical learning with an expert Egyptologist.

Also this week, 3GM enjoyed our trip to the library 3RA will be going again later in the term. The children enjoyed selecting their own books and browsing as well as writing postcards to older people who struggle to leave their homes, so they enjoy reading and replying to the children's letters.

Year 4

In Year 4 this week we have been watching Paddington and retelling the story of how Paddington went from Darkest Peru to meeting the Brown Family in London. As well we have started to look at the region of the West Midlands looking at the different counties within and beginning to identify key cities.



We would also like to remind all Year 4 children how important it is to regularly use TT Rockstars. We have also looked at how to show depth in our drawing, learning new terminology such as foreground, middle ground and background. Finally, during our Computing lessons, we have had the chance to play around with and create coding to use on a BBC Micro:bit!
